At New Lines, a normal week can range from hosting an <u>exclusive panel on U.S.-Kazakh</u> relations to publishing a <u>thought-provoking Dossier on the Supreme Court's decision to</u> <u>overturn Roe v. Wade.</u> As stewardship is one of New Lines' guiding principles, our research is driven by a shared commitment to promote global peace and security. In the last two weeks, the team has examined the crucial role played by U.S. policymakers in upholding and promoting democratic values within the U.S. and across the Maghreb, Middle East, and South America.

<u>Following a string of attacks labeled by the Islamic State as the "Raid of Revenge for the</u> <u>Two Sheikhs,"</u> mounting evidence indicates that the group is experiencing a resurgence in Syria. Abdullah al-Ghadhawi shows how U.S. policy failures in Syria left the country open for the Islamic State to regroup.

<u>Although several authoritarian states in the Maghreb have implemented transitional</u> justice measures to investigate state-sponsored human rights abuses, these often do not lead to true and lasting reforms. Alexander Kochenburger explains why states exposed to authoritarian environments need further support from U.S. policymakers.

<u>In the months leading up to the Oct. 2 general elections</u>, Brazil may face social unrest and political instability. Whichever of the frontrunners –President Jair Bolsonaro or former President Luiz Inácio "Lula" da Silva – wins, the Biden administration will need to consider how to respond to potential instability in Brazil.

The U.S. Supreme Court's decision to roll back federal protections for abortion access and bodily autonomy will affect several foreign policy issues. <u>In this Dossier, Emily Prey</u> and <u>Kinsey Spears explore the ramifications of the Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health</u> <u>Organization decision</u> and what options the U.S. government has to reverse this backslide on human rights.




